Carve a logging legacy!

The City of Campbell River is putting out a call for carvers who are interested in creating the new Logger Mike.

"The spar pole in Tyee Plaza has been without its resident high rigger since mid-March, and the City and Shoreline Arts Society are looking for a chainsaw carver to produce a replica of the current Logger Mike," says Ross Milnthorp, the City's general manager of parks, recreation and culture. "Both the old carving and the new will tour downtown as part of the Canada Day parade, and this year's Transformations on the Shore carving contest will offer a unique opportunity to have a photo taken with the new carving."

The successful carver will be chosen by a committee with members from the Campbell River Shoreline Arts Society and City staff.

Requirements to apply:

- The carving must be completed by June 26, 2016.
- Final touches can occur on site at Frank James Park, June 27 to 30, following the Transformations on the Shore carving contest.
- Wood for the carving will be supplied.
- Carver must have demonstrated artistic experience and arrange for a facility in which to complete the work.
- The selected carver will be paid \$7,500.
