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### **Zoning Bylaw review – Share your ideas for the future of Campbell River!**

What do you think about secondary dwellings, urban agriculture, shops and services and plans for the development of Quinsam Heights?

The City of Campbell River is updating its Zoning Bylaw and invites residents, business owners and community organizations to review proposed changes.

The next public consultation opportunity takes place Wednesday, Nov. 1 from 5 to 8 pm. at the Maritime Heritage Centre and will focus on key topic areas including secondary dwellings, urban agriculture, shops and services, the estuary, and plans for development in Quinsam Heights.

The drop-in event welcomes community members to attend any time throughout the evening to review and comment on the proposed policy directions.

*“The update is designed to align the Zoning Bylaw with the vision and land use directions outlined in the City’s Sustainable Official Community Plan,”* says Amber Zirnhelt, manager of long range planning and sustainability. *“Staff and Modus Planning have been developing policy directions based on community feedback we’ve heard to date, and we encourage people to review and share their thoughts on the proposed changes.”*

Following the open house, a draft Zoning Bylaw will be prepared for review by City Council, the City’s Advisory Planning and Environment Commission, and the community at another public consultation event in the new year.
