## CAMPBELL RIVER CITIZEN SATISFACTION SURVEY SEPT. 7-21


Randomly-selected residents aged 18 or older will be invited to answer questions by telephone on a wide range of topics.

# KEEP KIDS SAFE BACK TO SCHOOLTIPS FOR EVERYONE

With children heading back to school Tuesday September 6, the City, the school district and RCMP are asking drivers, cyclists and parents to watch out for kids along roadways.

### Safety tips for sharing the road with school buses:

- Driving behind a bus, allow a greater following distance than if you were driving behind a car. It will give you more time to stop once the lights start flashing.
- Never pass a bus from any direction if the lights are flashing and it is stopped to load or unload children.
- Drivers in both directions must stop and wait until the lights go off and the bus is moving before they can start driving again.
