Smoke alarm alerts occupant to house fire

At 2:55 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 13, Campbell River Fire Crews responded to a fire at a residence in the 2100 block of Dalton Rd. in Willow Point.

On arrival fire crews confirmed light smoke coming from the kitchen area on the second floor of a two-storey home. Crews were able to contain the fire to a small area in the kitchen.

"The activation of a smoke alarm on the second floor alerted the occupant in the home of the fire," says deputy fire chief Thomas Doherty. "The occupant was able to exit the home uninjured and call 911."

The fire was caused by combustible materials placed too close to a heat source.

"The Campbell River Fire Department reminds the public to check their smoke alarms regularly to ensure they are working properly because early detection by a smoke alarm may be your only chance of successfully escaping a fire," Doherty adds. "Newer, modern construction materials burn much hotter and faster than older construction materials, reducing your time to escape fire to just minutes from the time a smoke alarm activates."
