Seagull Walkway Upgrade News

WE'RE GETTING READY - HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Keeping You Informed!

The City of Campbell River intends to begin rehabilitation of the Seagull Walkway this year. The majority of the deficiencies requiring address are below the surface as major structural elements require upgrading. The surface works, once complete, will look much as they do today although they will be refreshed.

The work related to this project is generally described as a repair to the existing north and south sections. This will require removal of sections of the existing concrete walkway in order to address structural deficiencies below replacement of subsurface materials, repairs to damaged piling and timber retaining wall, after which the surface of the walkway will be reinstated. The street lighting will also be evaluated for replacement and subject to external funding opportunities, be replaced as part of the project. This will result in closure of the walkway while construction is underway. Upgrades to the bridge will not be completed at this time. In an effort to help you better understand

Upgrades to the bridge will not be completed at this time. In an effort to help you better understand the project impacts, the City is prepared to provide a detailed overview of the project.

The project team is currently working to complete the design and attain necessary regulatory approvals with an anticipated start of construction in Summer 2021. While we understand this may be viewed as a poor time of year for this work to take place given adjacent businesses, we are required to ensure best value is attained for City taxpayers which requires normal construction season timings be followed. In addition, regulatory requirements will dictate timing of works requiring access to the marine basin.

Please be advised that use of the City controlled parking lot adjacent at Robert Oster Park will be affected by the project resulting from temporary reduction of available stalls.



While we understand that this project may result in some noise concerns during construction, efforts will be made to try and mitigate. As a result of COVID-19, the Economic Development department has resources and programs available to all Campbell River businesses including CR Grant Assist, a program designed to help businesses apply for federal and provincial grant funding.
