CONSTRUCTION NOW UNDERWAY

Crews from J. Cote & Son Excavating are now on site and working away at the start of the Waterfront Sewer Upgrade route. Construction has started at the parking lot of the Maritime Heritage Centre, where a tie-in to the existing sewer main is located. That work is wrapping up by mid-August and then crews will move southward, continuing until October.

Progress has been going well so far, and impact at the Maritime Heritage Centre parking lot will continue to be reduced as construction moves further along the highway.

Here's what you need to know for the coming month:

- Construction will primarily be on the west side of the highway (uphill side) as it proceeds along Hwy 19A
- Two lanes of traffic will be largely maintained, although there may be interruptions or unscheduled traffic flow changes – always watch for signage and flaggers.
- Roadside parking in the areas of construction will be temporarily removed in order to accommodate two-lane traffic. Temporary 'no parking' signs will be installed to advise residents and the public.
- There will be no changes to your services in the coming few months. See story on pg. 2 for more.

Phase 1 of the Waterfront Sewer Upgrade will run from Maritime Heritage Centre to 1st Ave. The project will replace aging infrastructure with a new, larger utility that will accommodate the expected growth of our community.

In 2019, new lift (pump) stations for the sewer will be constructed along the route. Phase 2, which will continue south to near Rockland Road, will be constructed in 2020.





SCHEDULE OF WORK

The below table shows an estimate of the work progress. Please note, this schedule can change.

Dates	Area
July	Maritime Heritage Centre and adjacent Hwy 19A hill
August	Hwy 19A, Est. 6th Ave to 4th Ave
September	Hwy 19A, 4th Ave to 2nd Ave
October	Hwy 19A, finish to 1st Ave, paving and landscaping

CONNECTING TO THE NEW PIPE

Homeowners along Hwy 19A may have noticed spray painted markings on the end of their driveway or on sidewalks near their home. Wondering what these are all about? They mark where pipe will connect each property to the main sewer main – however, how these are used by each home will be different.

East (Water) Side of Hwy 19A

- SOUTH OF 321 Island Hwy: Homes will be connected to the new sewer main and these markings indicate where the current service is understood to be. There will be a short interruption in service before the project end as your home's connection is switched over – the contractor will be in touch closer to the date to make any specific plans that are needed.
- NORTH OF 321 Island Hwy: A pipe will be installed from the sewer main to the marked location to allow for future hookup to the new line. However, wastewater in these homes currently flows downhill to a small collector pipe running along the foreshore, and that will not be changing at this time. The connecting pipes installed at the highway are only for potential future connections.

West (Uphill) Side of Hwy 19A

 All homes that front onto Hwy 19A between 6th Ave and 1st Ave will be connected to the new sewer main. The markings indicate where the current connection is understood to be. There will be a short interruption in service before the project end as your home's connection is switched over – the contractor will be in touch closer to the date to make any specific plans that are needed.



PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

Construction means that people in traffic (both vehicles AND pedestrians) need to pay extra attention to changing patterns, signage and flaggers. Throughout the construction route, there will be closures along sidewalks, and changes in vehicle lanes will require additional attention at crosswalks.

If you're walking, take extra care and look ahead to make sure you are on the safe route to get where you're going. For vehicle traffic – watch for pedestrians who are also navigating changes to the regular patterns of the area.



KEEPING YOU INFORMED

The project team is committed to updating area residents as the work moves forward. Those who will be directly impacted will hear more details as construction nears individual residences. News bulletins like this will be shared monthly or as needed as work progresses.
