

The Ministry of Environment's Venting Index <http://www.env.gov.bc.ca/epd/epdpa/venting/> (also available by phoning 1-888-281-2992) contains smoke-control forecasts for the current and following day, as well as archived smoke-control forecasts for the last several years. If the Ventilation Index indicates POOR or FAIR, then smoke that results from burning will tend to build up, causing air pollution. To avoid such pollution, outdoor burning is restricted when the index is POOR or FAIR. Campbell River is considered the Central Island Zone, listed under Coast.
