The City of Campbell River welcomes public input on amendments to the 2018-2027 Financial Plan that reflect decisions made by Council throughout 2018.

The Community Charter requires the City to amend the budget bylaw with these changes and balance the budget prior to the adoption of next year's Financial Plan bylaw, which will be considered in December 2018.

Campbell River's Most Unwanted Part 3 – Yellow Flag Iris

How to identify Yellow Flag Iris

- The only "wet-footed" yellow iris
- Has entirely yellow flowers
- Blooms April to July

What to do about Yellow Flag Iris on private property

- Dig out small patches of plants
- For larger patches that are harder to dig all at once, be sure to at least clip seed heads off in July
- Wear gloves as this plant can give off a toxic resin
- Grow native and regional plants instead. Gardeners and landscapers can find alternatives to Yellow Flag Iris in the *Grow Me Instead* booklet from the Invasive Species Council of BC.

How to dispose of Yellow Flag Iris

Do not dispose in backyard compost, the curbside yard waste program or the yard waste drop off at Willis Rd. Remnants of Yellow Flag Iris must be bagged and taken to the Campbell River Waste Management Centre (landfill) to dispose at a reduced tipping fee (\$65 per metric tonne).
