Have your say about food trucks downtown! Survey seeks public input

The City of Campbell River is running a survey to gage community appetite for food trucks in downtown Campbell River.

The City is proposing a food truck pilot program for the summer of 2019 as part of a larger revitalization initiative aimed at bringing more variety and activity downtown. Several of the City's public consultation events related to downtown revitalization, including a 2016 Refresh Downtown survey, indicated strong public demand for more diverse food options, including food trucks.

"The proposed pilot program is a response to the reoccurring theme the City has heard that people are eager to see greater food variety in downtown Campbell River," says Amber Zirnhelt, the City's Long Range Planning and sustainability manager. "Research shows that food trucks bring people into public spaces, which could attract more people to the downtown to eat, and shop. We see the pilot program as a way to create lively streets that benefit both the community and downtown businesses,"

The City is seeking survey responses from local businesses, restaurant owners and community members. The City is also conducting door-to-door surveys this month with downtown businesses and restaurant owners to answer questions and gather feedback that will help shape the direction of the pilot program as well as the long-term suitability of food trucks in Campbell River.
