NEXSTREAM TECH COMPETITION LAUNCHES JAN. 26—SUBMIT YOUR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST TODAY! Up to \$300,000 in total prizes up for grabs. New challenge area for 2022: creative industries and tourism.

The City of Campbell River and Campbell River Area Angel Group (CRAAG) are counting down to the launch of Campbell River's own NexStream Tech Competition on Jan. 26. This is the third year for the technology and innovation competition. This year's competition is open to British Columbia businesses and innovators, with up to \$300,000 in total prizes up for grabs.

NexStream 3.0 is accepting applications for five challenges inspired by our coastal region: health and emergency preparedness, food security, sustainable resource management, a wildcard challenge and a new creative industries and tourism challenge. To participate, complete the online expression of interest form available at nexstream.is/expression-of-interest-2022 before 11:59 p.m. PST on Feb. 16.

"The NexStream Tech Competition is committed to helping innovators develop their products and businesses. And from day one, we've been focused on driving positive change for the industries in our coastal region," says Rose Klukas, manager of economic development. "A new creative industries and tourism challenge has been added to this year's competition, reflecting the diversity of our local economy and opening up the field to even more innovation."

NexStream 3.0 is open to entrepreneurs and businesses with fewer than 100 employees that are based in British Columbia. Teams can enter more than one category. The competition and individual categories may have more than one winning team.
