Recycling Directories

Construction Waste



Hauling and metal sorting services are offered by **ABC Recycling** and **Steel Pacific Recycling**. Construction waste can also be taken directly to the **Campbell River Waste Management Centre** (landfill) for self-sorting. If materials are in good condition, they may be accepted for donation at the **Habitat for Humanity ReStore**.

Hazardous Items: Dispose of Properly!



When improperly disposed, hazardous items can harm people and the environment. For example, batteries leach mercury, cadmium and other toxins from our landfill. Medications can easily enter the ecosystem, harming fish and other creatures we depend on for a healthy environment.

Batteries



All Batteries can be recycled at no charge at the **Campbell River Waste Management Centre** (landfill). Other options include:

- Alkaline batteries are accepted at **London Drugs**.
- Rechargeable batteries are accepted at **Staples** and **The Source by Circuit City**.
- Automotive batteries are accepted at the **Encorp Return-It Centre/Campbell River Bottle Depot**.



Compact Fluorescent Lamps

Fluorescent lights contain mercury which can leach into the groundwater when disposed of incorrectly. CFLs can be returned to some local retailers, including **Home Depot** and **London Drugs**.



E-Waste, Gasoline, Flammable Liquids, Paint & Pesticides



The **Encorp Return-It Centre/Campbell River Bottle Depot** is the primary recycler for these items in the city. Liquids must be in approved ULC containers. Containers can contain up to either 20 litres of gasoline, 9 litres of kerosene or 10 litres of all others. For other drop-off locations, check at point of purchase. Spray paint cans are accepted; hair spray and non-combustible aerosols should be completely emptied and disposed of as regular garbage.



Medications

Unwanted or expired medications can be returned free of charge to **any pharmacy**.
